We need more clubs to request matching funds from the trip raffle proceeds. A final accounting of gross proceeds shows ticket sales of \$92,995. This is a tremendous response from District Rotarians and represents probably the highest-gross proceeds ever for a District fund raiser. Net proceeds available for matching distribution to clubs will be close to \$70,000. Thus far, we have received requests for only some \$30,000 in matching funds from the raffle. Don't fail to take advantage of this opportunity to make a significant year-end contribution to the Annual Programs Fund, Polio or GRSP Endowment. If you haven't sent me your request, please do so immediately.
